
Sergeant Gander: A Canadian Hero's Extraordinary Story of Courage and Survival

On October 30, 1917, Gander was tending to wounded soldiers in a shell-hole when he was himself hit by a shell. He was badly wounded, but refused to be evacuated. Instead, he continued to tend to the wounded until he was Free Downloaded to do so by his commanding officer.

Gander's actions saved the lives of many soldiers. He was awarded the Victoria Cross for his bravery and devotion to duty. The citation for his medal reads:

"For most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty. When his battalion was heavily bombarded and had suffered severe casualties, he went out repeatedly under the most intense shell fire and rescued many wounded men, carrying them back to the dressing station. After the war, Gander returned to Canada and worked as a farmer. He died in 1974 and is buried in London, Ontario.

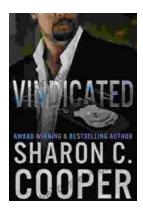
